Book Week


One of my favourite events for the year has always been Book Week and the Book Week Parade. This year, after 2 years of restricted parades we return to form! Our Book Week Parade is like no other, as we parade up and down Main Rd for our entire community.

Everyone is welcome to join in the fun of the parade – parents, grandparents, younger siblings etc are all welcome to dress up and parade with us (don't be the only one out of costume!)

Our parade leaves the school at the Main Rd top gate, going up Main Rd to the pede strian crossing at main Rd and Fifth St before walking back down past council down to the crossing near Pippi's (Main Rd and Speers St) and back up to the school past Speers Point Library.

The parade is on Thursday 25 August and we start at 9.30 am. We'll return to school ready for the "Bake, Cake and Shake" stall at 10.30 am run by our senior students as a Year 6 fundraiser.





Attendance and COVID Safe Practices

Please be mindful that from time to time we are still having COVID cases within the school. We send out our school communication when this occurs however we are unable to identify which class, which given the nature of school and playgrounds, contact would not be limited to just a class.

The message remains the same, if your child is sick or has symptoms, please keep them home. Even with good hygiene, air purifiers, cleaning etc things still get shared and passed on. Not being at school when sick helps prevent the spread.

However, coughs can linger, asthma is real and kids can try and pull a sickie – we understand and as always, we apply a common sense approach to these. We're not asking students to stay home when they have treatable hay fever (spring is close) etc.

It's still a very mixed message because everyday they are well enough to be at school, we need to make sure students are attending school to counter against increased absence rates.

Attendance Letters

Last term we sent out Attendance letters for students whose attendance rate was below the Department's 85% minimum attendance rate. These will soon be coming out again.

I had questions as to why I was sending out the letters in the middle of high sickness / pandemic times and the purpose is the same this time – simply awareness raising. With so many things going on it's unrealistic to think parents are tracking student sick days. That's part of my job. However, unless we communicate with you, it is something that is very easily to be unaware of.

So over the next two weeks, we will be sending out letters for attendance below the minimum 85%, regardless of known COVID cases or any other long absences.

What comes from it? It's awareness raising. It's an opportunity for you to be informed. That's it. In some cases where there is extreme absences there are supports offered to help improve attendance. For most part, however, it is simply giving you the information.

Early Arrivals

On a daily basis we are seeing some 15 to 20 students arriving or being dropped off to school before 8.30 am who are not attending OOSH. There are no staff supervising students prior to 8.30 am and it is not safe for students to be on grounds without supervision. There have been times when those students who are here early are out-of-bounds or misbehaving which presents a huge risk to student safety.

If work arrangements require an early morning drop off, please have a chat with our OOSH Care provider, Elise at <u>Big Child Care</u>.

Uniform Expectations

Over the last few months we've seen a decline in the correct wearing of our school uniform and we will be working with students to lift back to our usual high standards. Our school uniform is a big part of who we are and the pride we have within ourselves and our school.

Black shoes, white socks, school hats and no jewellery will be a big part of our uniform focus.
